



Buzz Saw
Block Size: 30" x 30"

Work with a super-sized 18° traditional Dresden Plate template with a 12-1/2" height. My custom designed templates include both 30° and 60° lines on them for variations within the wedge (the angle for Buzz Saw is 30°). Twenty of these wedges make a 24" diameter! It looks like a buzz saw to me, hence the name.

The block is sewn in four quarters and then each is stitched to a background using interfacing to turn the blade tips under. The center is added last, also interfaced for ease of turning.

Select your own favorite fabric palette

The kit fee includes the multi-sized Vortex/Dresden Plate ruler (12-1/2" height), along with a multi-page, well illustrated hand-out with clear instructions for completing your own version of the Buzz Saw.

Pattern/kit fee: \$20.00

Fabric Supplies (refer to the colors in my sample above)

- One 12-1/2" x wof strip EACH of two contrasting prints (my pink and dark blue fabrics)
- 1-1/2 yards white for background and binding
- 4-1/2" square of blue for center circle
- Lightweight interfacing (enough for four 6" x 20" rectangles and 5" square) NOT fusibles (ie, NOT Wonder Under) I'm referring to sewing interfacing for garments. You can find this in Joann's, fabric shops, etc.
- 6" square of freezer paper
- Monofilament thread for machine applique (we probably won't get to this part in our 3 hour class)

***Please bring all your extra fabrics in case of a mistake (did I say that?)!
