

## Playing with Fabric Paints Supply List (6 Hour Class)

Fabric: Pre-washed cotton fabric, either plain or previously dyed. Amount determined by how fast you work – can be up to 4 yards. Smaller pieces are more manageable, so please cut some of these into fat quarter sized pieces before class. In addition, please bring one fat quarter pre-washed plain white cotton fabric (can be muslin).

A variety of textured found objects for patterning such as: wire whisks, construction fence, mesh from clementine boxes, leaves, string, rubber bands, corks, bubble wrap, kitchen sink mats, etc. Let your imagination run wild! Check out dollar stores and home improvement stores for fun things with patterns.

A wooden or acrylic block, approximately 4"x4" to make a stamp. This needs to be at least 1/8" thick, but can be thicker. Please choose whichever option will be the least expensive and easiest for you to obtain.

A sponge to cut into stamps, an xacto knife and small cutting mat.

Brushes – inexpensive foam brushes for painting, also an inexpensive 1" to 3" brush to cut.

A foam roller & small spray bottle.

A few plastic spoons.

A palette – A few styrofoam plates or meat trays from the supermarket work great.

Scissors – for cutting paper and a few sheets of newspaper.

Silkscreen – Any size that you already have. If you don't already own one, use old curtain sheers and an embroidery hoop to make a temporary screen as an inexpensive alternative.

An inspirational photo.

A roll of inexpensive large size garbage bags or old newspapers to lay under your fabrics while they air dry. Plan according to how much fabric you are bringing.

Bring gloves and wear old clothes. Bring an apron if desired. Bring a nail brush to help clean fingernails.

There will be a \$25 per person kit fee for fabric paint.
