

# Facings, an Alternative Edge Finish to Bindings - Shannon Shirley

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## Supplies needed:

Three separate pre quilted panels, at least the size of a placemat but larger would be great especially for the unusual shaped facings. You may bring actual quilts that you wish to face if you prefer. Nothing larger than about 30"

### Straight Facings

Quilted piece approximately 14" x 20"

Facing strips of fabric, 2 1/2" x length and width of quilted piece, ex. 2 - 14", 2 - 20"

(You need fabric strips long enough for all four sides of your quilt)

### Scalloped Facings

Quilted piece approximately 14" x 20"

Facing strips of fabric, 3 1/2" x length and width of quilted piece, ex. 2 - 14", 2 - 20"

(You need fabric strips long enough for all four sides of your quilt)

### Unusual Shaped Facings

Quilted piece approximately 20" x 20"

Facing strips of fabric, 5" x length and width of quilted piece, ex. 4 - 20"

(You need fabric strips long enough for all four sides of your quilt)

Thread for your sewing machine

Ruler with a 45° line

Pencil

Point turner

Pinking shears if you own them

Strips of scrap paper as long as your quilt sides and as wide as your facing strips

Sewing machine in good working order, manuals, cords, extra needles.

Basic sewing supplies

**You do not need to cut the facing strips in advance but the items to be faced must be pre quilted.**
