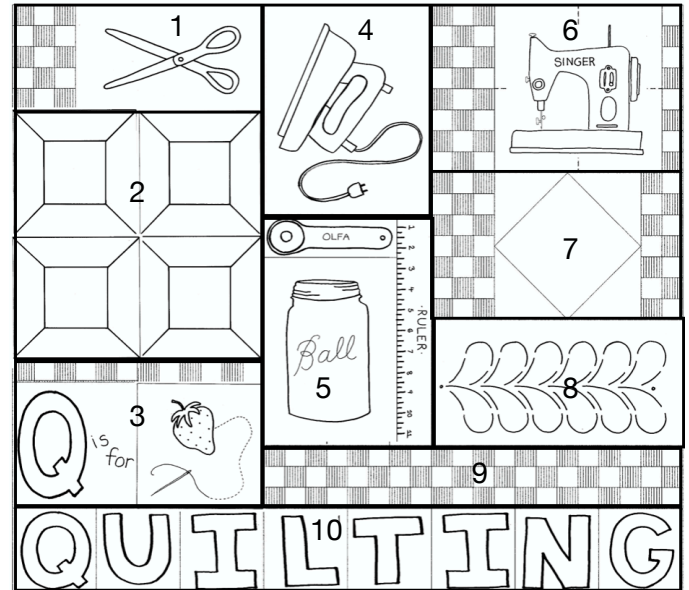


Q is for Quilting

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Required pattern is \$15, payable to Instructor.

This quilt was made with some hand embroidered blocks, some pieced blocks, and some appliqué blocks. I use cut-away fusible appliqué with hand blanket stitches as my method of choice but you may use whatever appliqué method you prefer.

There is not a specific fabric list. This is a great quilt for scraps. Pick a wide range of colors that you like together. You may want to refer to the photograph to make sure you include colors you might like for specific blocks, like bluish green for the canning jar.

Sewing machine with foot pedal, plug, manual, extra needles etc.

Neutral thread for machine piecing.

Scissors

Heat-n-Bond Lite, 1 yard

Mat, ruler and rotary cutter to trim embroidered blocks before piecing.

Marking tool to trace embroidery patterns, I use a mechanical pencil or a blue water soluble marker. If there is something else you prefer, please bring it.

Embroidery needle - I do not use a hoop to embroider but if you use one, please bring it.

Embroidery floss, assorted colors. (If you are machine appliquéing bring an assortment of thread.)

Exacto knife if you have one or detail scissors.

OPTIONAL prep, refer to diagram above.

BLOCKS 1,3,6,7,9 - If you want to prepare the checkerboard section in advance they are cut 1½" x 1½".

FYI - The background of the canning jar and sewing machine are each four different fabrics.
