Hunter Star Quilt

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Supply List:

This dynamic star design is a long loved pattern that's probably on many bucket lists. It was traditionally made with bias shapes and y-seams that made it challenging to construct. But with the right tools and a few up-to-date techniques, it's actually easy! Learn Deb Tucker's accurate oversize/trim-down technique and utilize strip-piecing to eliminate the bias seams.

Required Equipment

- > Sewing machine in GOOD WORKING order with owner's manual
- ½" Foot, (Bernina #37, 57 or 97)
- New needle, 50 or 60 wt. good quality thread and a supply of wound bobbins
- General sewing kit: scissors, seam ripper, pins, stiletto
- > Small cutting mat and rotary cutter with new blade for your workstation
- Studio 180 Large Rapid Fire Hunter's Star Template backed with Grippy non-slip spray coating or Invisigrip by Omnigrid
- Rapid Fire Hunter's Star Instructions (that comes with the template)
- ➤ Medium sized acrylic ruler...6"X14" or similar.
- Painter's tape

Fabric Requirements

The following fabric requirements are for a 2 color Hunter Star Wall Quilt 32" X 32" using 8" blocks. If you want to make a larger quilt you can adjust the fabric and precut requirements accordingly. Let me know if you need help with that.

Cotton Fabrics:

Dark Fabric: 1 YardLight Fabric: 1 Yard

➤ Calculate more yardage of the color you choose for any borders and binding. (For the 32" X 32" Wall Quilt with no borders you will need 1/3 yard for binding and 1 yard for backing.)

Prepare & label the following Pre-Cuts:

> From Dark Fabric:

- Cut 2 strips 7 ½" X Width of Fabric (WOF)
 - Cut into 8 7 ½" squares
 - Then cut into 16 half square triangles
- o Cut 3 strips 2 ¼" X WOF
- Cut 4 strips 2 ½" X WOF

> From Light Fabric:

- Cut 2 strips 7 ½" X Width of Fabric (WOF)
 - Cut into 8 7 ½" squares
 - Then cut into 16 half square triangles
- o Cut 3 strips 2 ¼" X WOF
- o Cut 4 strips 2 ½" X WOF
