

Tiny Quilt Block Pins

Foundation Paper-Piecing Workshop with Tina Craig

Learn the basics of tiny foundation paper piecing, and leave class wearing a quilt block label pin. If pins are not your thing, magnets will also be available. Most of the 15 patterns finish as 1.25" square blocks. Choose the pattern that best suits your own skill level and style. Tina will share many tips and tricks for successful paper piecing which will be helpful on projects of any size.

Class Kit

Class kit will include:

Assorted paper patterns including traditional quilt blocks and seasonal designs
Mat board, batting, Ultrasuede for backing,
and 2 pin backs or magnets
Glue will be provided

Supplies

Fabric scraps – Small scraps can be used to complete these designs, but I don't use anything smaller than 1" square. Charm squares and 1.5" strips work well. For the best contrast, use solids or prints that read as a solid.

The outer border is cut from a strip 1 ¼" wide. This is a nice place to use small scale prints.

Sewing machine, foot pedal and power cord

Featherweights are welcome!

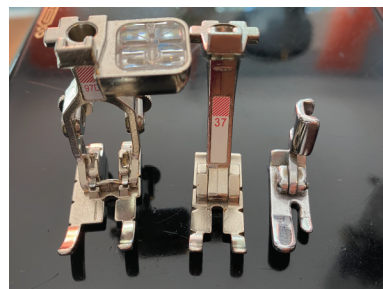
Presser foot that is open in front of the needle similar to those shown

Size 80 or 90 topstitch needle, preferred

Neutral piecing thread

Sharp scissors

Rotary cutter, small mat, 6X6" ruler



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
