

Metro Rings Student Supply List

Pattern:

Metro Rings quilt pattern by Sew Kind of Wonderful

Basic Sewing Kit:

- Fabric shears
- Patchwork pins
- Thread snips
- Seam ripper
- Machine piecing thread in a neutral color to match your fabrics

Rotary Cutting Supplies:

- Quick Curve Ruler by Sew Kind of Wonderful (standard size, not the mini size)
- Rotary cutter with fresh blade (45 mm works best with the Quick Curve Ruler)
- Acrylic rulers: I like the following sizes:
 - 6" x 24"
 - 4" x 14"
 - 10" or larger *square* ruler (necessary for squaring up blocks if you don't have the "Sew Square 10" ruler)
- Cutting mat: 18" x 24" is a good size

Additional Supplies:

- Spray starch, Best Press, or your favorite starch alternative
- Fine Point Metallic Sharpie marker (the metallic marker shows up especially well), or adhesive ruler markers for marking your ruler

Optional Supplies:

- Omnigrid's Invisigrip (helps prevent slipping when applied to the back of your Quick Curve Ruler)
- Large rotating cutting mat
- Tailor's Awl
- "Sew Square 10" ruler by Sew Kind of Wonderful
- Wooly Pressing Bar (for pressing seams open)

Sewing Machine, etc:

- Sewing machine in working order
- 1/4" patchwork foot, if you have
- Sewing machine needles

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Fabric Requirements (as listed on pattern):

- 1 Jelly Roll or 35 2-1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips
- 5 yards background fabric
- 1/2 yard *each* of two different fabrics for setting triangles
- 4-3/4 yards backing fabric
- 1/2 yard binding fabric

The pattern yields a 57x76" quilt. If you want to make your quilt bigger than the pattern dimensions, you can simply stitch more blocks; in that case, you will need to purchase a second jelly roll or cut additional strips. You will also need additional background fabric. Or, you can add a border or two.

Please purchase your pattern and cut your background squares and strips (if not using a precut jelly roll) prior to class.

Feel free to watch Sew Kind of Wonderful's tutorial prior to class, but don't stress over the details; we will be covering everything you need to know to stitch your blocks in class.
