DESCRIPTION: This whimsical twist on the classic Dresden Plate will bring a whir-r-r to any room it lands in! It's a fat-quarter friendly project and can be made into eight sizes from a pillow to a king-sized quilt. Learn tips for beginning applique and how to piece the Dresden blocks.

PATTERN: Hover by Rachel Rossi...available www. <https://www.rachelrossi.design/> or your local quilt shop. All students are required to purchase a pattern to take this class.

TOOLS NEEDED FOR CLASS:

- Sewing machine in good working order
- Sewing machine manual
- ¼" presser foot
- 50 wt. or 60 wt. cotton or silk finished thread; neutral for piecing and colors to match fabric for applique. You can also choose clear monofilament thread instead of the colored thread for the applique stitching.
- Ample supply of wound bobbins
- 24"X 6" (or similar) ruler and smaller ruler
- Rotary cutter with new blade. I can't stress enough the need for a very sharp blade for this project. Your blade should cut through fabric on the first pass. If not, you will become frustrated and not get a good result. 😊
- Stiletto, scissors, seam ripper etc.
- Best Press or other fabric starch
- Flat head quilting straight pins.
- Elmers's Disappearing Purple Glue Stick or equal.
- A template for the Dresden template is provided in the pattern but I highly recommend using the Creative Grids 10 Degree Ruler.
- Pressing Stick
- Cutting mat 18"X24" to use at your workstation.

*Personal irons and freestanding sewing machine tables are not permitted in the classrooms. Ironing stations are provided for your use.
